RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All entries must have been made on the Official Entry Forms and in the hands of the Secretary not later than TUESDAY 7TH JUNE 2011.
2. All exhibits must be the bona fide production of the exhibitor.
3. The marquee will be open for staging exhibits at 9.00 am. And this must be completed by 10.30 am. Judging will commence at 11.00 am and no exhibit may be removed before 4.30pm.
4. The Marquee will be closed to the public after 4.30pm Exhibits should be removed between 4.30pm and 5.00pm, after which any item left will be disposed of by the Stewards.
5. Prize winners may collect prize money from the Produce Tent Stewards between 4.00pm and 4.30pm on the Show Day. Prize money not collected will be forfeited.
6. Presentation of Cups and trophies will take place at 3.30pm in the Produce Tent.
7. The Committee do not hold themselves responsible for the loss or damage to any exhibit, but all possible care will be taken.
8. Not more than two entries from each competitor will be accepted in any Class in any Section.
9. The Committee will appoint judges, whose decision will be final.
10. Any complaints to be lodged with the Secretary. Deposit of £10 before 3.00pm on the day of the Show.
11. All schools are responsible for collection of exhibits at end of the show. Failure to do so will result in exhibits being disposed.
12. The presentation of exhibits will be taken into consideration.
13. Plain labels only to be used.
14. All articles in the Handicraft Section must be unlaundered.
15. All cakes and breads must be cut.
16. For Special Awards, 3 points will be allocated for a first prize, 2 points or a second prize and 1 point for third prize. In the event of a joint placing, each competitor will be allocated the full points.
17. Any trade names on containers may disqualify.
18. Admission to show is £6 per person.
19. No entry fees will be charges.

Date and Walnut Cake

7 fl oz (210ml) boiling water

6 oz (175g) dates, chopped

$\frac{3}{4}$ level teaspoon bicarbonate of soda

6 oz (175g) light muscovado sugar

2 oz (50g) soft margarine

1 egg, beaten

8 oz (225g) self-raising flour

2 oz (50g) walnuts, chopped

Heat the oven to 350°F, 180°C, gas Mark 4. Grease and line an 8 inch (20cm) square cake tin with greased greaseproof paper.

PTO

Measure the water, dates and bicarbonate of soda into a bowl and leave to stand for five minutes

Put the sugar and margarine into a bowl and cream together, then beat in the egg and the date mixture. Fold in the flour together with the walnuts and mix lightly until thoroughly blended. Turn the mixture into the tin and level out evenly.

Bake in the oven for about an hour until risen and slightly shrinking away from the sides of the tin. A skewer should come out clean when pushed into the centre of the cake.

Leave to cool in the tin for a few minutes, then turn out, peel off paper and finish cooling on a wire rack.
